# Principal's Bulletin February 11<sup>th</sup>, 2024

#### **Buzz Aldrin Mission Statement:**

We believe that all students can learn, achieve, and grow, in a safe and secure environment.

- **BAMS STEM Challenges Carnival Night**: On Thursday evening, dozens of families came out to the BAMS gymnasium to play and experience the table-top carnival games that students in STEM Challenges designed and constructed during the fall semester. Many family members commented how much they were impressed with the creativity and engineering that was on display. STEM Challenges proposes a "problem" that students must resolve by creating a physical solution. In this case, students had to design a carnival game of chance that was unfairly rigged in favor of the game operator, but also gave a sense to the player that it was a fair game and that they had a better chance to win than lose. As part of the project, students had to collect win/loss data and calculate this percentage to fine tune their game. In addition, they made a rough draft, peer-reviewed each other's games, and then created and much-improved, final draft. Thank you to Mr. Taylor and his STEM Challenges students for hosting a wonderful Carnival Night on Thursday evening. The students did a really nice job creating and designing games and activities for others to enjoy. Thank you to the student and families who came out to support. Great job to all!

- **Buzz Aldrin Mural Painting Debut:** Our Semester 1 Mural Painting students ٠ just finished an ocean-themed mural at the Montclair Public Library Bellevue Branch! Students walked over with teacher, Lauren Cirrito, to meet with Children's Librarian Kristen Comeaux to see the space. They had the opportunity to hear Ms. Comeaux's thoughts for the project, learn about the library, and to measure the actual wall. After brainstorming ideas with students, an ocean-themed mural was decided on. Working with an actual-size section of the wall space in the classroom, students first painted the underwater background in sections, with acrylic paint on mural cloth. Next, they researched the sea creature they chose to paint, and got to work drawing, cutting out, and painting those as well. The last week of the semester, the mural was installed at the library, and students were able to put their own sea creatures up on the underwater wall. This project was a great example of a STEAM mix of art & science in action at Buzz! An adjacent section of library wall will be painted with the same ocean theme by the Semester 2 Mural Painting class. It was such an honor to be asked to paint this by MPL, and students appreciate the significance of being able to create public art in our community.
