

For English language arts next week students are going to be studying Malcolm X from his autobiography "Learning to Read".

Social Studies

Students worked on a small group presentation during class this week. Next Monday and Tuesday they are presenting their work as one of the early colonies - will they accept French Catholic colonists from Canada? Which colony will the French Canadian Catholics choose?

Next Wednesday/Thursday, students have a mid-unit quiz. In class, we reviewed the handouts they should be studying, which are posted in Google Classroom. The Quiz will be 25 multiple choice questions.

7th Grade Trip to the Chelsea Art Galleries and Highline:

Our 7th grade students visited the Art Galleries in Chelsea, NY today and walked the Highline from the Shed at the Hudson Yards to the art galleries. The focus of this trip was on urban redevelopment and the connection between art and contemporary social trends. See pictures below.

Math

The student's stock graph assignment is due next Friday, March 4. The students picked a company and recorded its closing price every Monday and Thursday from January 9 through March 2. The students then plot prices on a graph and calculate the percentage increase/decrease from one day to the next.

Science

This week students learned how to make a wet mount slide. They prepared onion (plant cells) and donated their own cheek cells (animal) to view under the microscope. This Friday students are getting assessed on the parts of the compound light microscope. Next week we continue adding to our life science vocabulary as we explore the structure and function of plant/animal cells. Please keep in mind this is a vocabulary heavy unit so we are encouraging review games, the use of flash cards and other study strategies to help acquire these new words.

ELA

Students are starting to read the American classic, *To Kill a Mockingbird*, by Harper Lee. We are analyzing the historical context and setting of the novel to better understand the novel's theme. As we read, we will explore bigger ideas such as racism, prejudice, discrimination, and intolerance.

ELA/SS For the whole month of February, students will be working on a collaborative Social Studies and ELA project to analyze the Black experience in America from 1800 to the present day. In groups, students will research a specific historical topic and create a newspaper that reports the experiences of African Americans.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

We are beginning our new round of volunteering to start on February 10th by going to Toni's Kitchen. We will be going full force on February 24 with, hopefully, a couple of new partners in volunteering. It has been wonderful thus far!
