Executive Functioning Class for students:

We are thrilled to announce Renaissance Middle School will be offering a 4-week session focused on developing executive function skills. This 4-week session will be offered on Thursdays during lunch throughout the month of December.

SESSION DETAILS:

This 4-week session will focus on developing the following executive function skills for middle school students: working memory (accessing information, remembering instructions, paying attention), inhibitory control (impulse control, emotional regulation) and cognitive flexibility (flexible thinking, ability to adapt behavior). This session will provide students with essential skills needed to be successful in school and beyond. Each session parents will be provided with a follow-up summary and "homework". Homework is not required but strongly encouraged in order to deepen your child's experience.

SESSION FACILITATOR: Kristen Niemczyk-Kistner, Ph.D.

Dr. K is the child study team school social worker based out of Renaissance Middle School and Montclair High School. Dr. K has a bachelor's degree in psychology and both a master's and a Ph.D. in social work. Dr. K is also a certified Positive Discipline

Parent Educator, certified school social worker, and a licensed social worker. Dr. K has acquired approximately 18 years of professional experience as a child study team school social worker in three New Jersey school districts. Dr. K also has approximately 7 years of teaching experience working as an adjunct professor at both William Paterson University and Montclair State University.
